Scaip an t-eolas seo ar dhaoine eile!

Joe Noonan — “As a postman - for over twenty years - I have travelled the byways and boreens around Lough Graney. In fact it was only when I became a postman that I realised how little I knew about the parish in which I lived and more importantly about the people and interesting characters that lived around me.”

The **East Clare Way** is 172km in length. In the early 1990s people from the ten parishes of East Clare came together with a common goal to bring sensitive tourism to the more remote areas of East Clare. Walking was an activity suggested to achieve this common aim.

Cuimhneamh an Chláir (Memories of Clare) is an independent, not-for-profit, community based organisation that aims to record, document, archive and share the memories, experiences, customs, traditions and practices that characterise County Clare.

Ireland Reaching Out South-East Galway Pilot Project — Ireland XO is an Irish government sponsored project identifying who emigrated from Ireland, tracing them and their descendants across the world. In this way, local Irish communities can be expanded to virtual communities engaging all of their people worldwide.

Inside Out — In 2009 a group of young people from Lough Graney Youth Club began working with film artist in residence Hillary Dully on a film project about Killanena/Flagmount. They share their experiences of taking a snapshot in time of this very rural community.

Aughty Public Arts Projects is an ongoing community focused art project involving local artists. Commissioned by Galway County Arts Office, supported by Clare Arts Office and the Ground Up Artists Collective, the project is curated by Dr Áine Phillips who will give a presentation on the project so far and its future outcomes.

Feakle International Traditional Music Festival — Feakle nestles near the Sliabh Aughty mountains and consists of a community of approx. 800 people. Our musical culture has always been a major focal point over the years.

Fiddle player **Martin Hayes** remains grounded in the music he grew up with in his own locality, Maghera, Feakle, East County Clare where the music which he learned from his late father, P. Joe Hayes, the legendary leader of the long-lived Tulla Ceili Band, profoundly influenced his musical accent and ideas forever after.’

Getting there...



Caher House, Lough Graney Estate, east Clare

Travelling from Gort Co Galway:

Take Ennis Road out of Gort, after 6.4 km turn left after Mark's Garage, drive 10 km to Tony Mac's Pub & Garage, turn left at next junction after pub, Lough Graney Estate is first turn left.

Travelling from Scarriff Co Clare:

Take the flagmount road, past church on left, drive for 16 km turn left for Caher village, lake on your right, next turn right is entrance to Lough Graney Estate.

Travelling from Feakle Co Clare:

Driving through Feakle with kilanena Church on your left, continue to Peppers pub, keep left at pub with Peppers pub now on your right, taking the Gort road, continue for 5 km, turn right for Caher village, Lough Graney Estate first turn on left.
